□ **Main Purpose:**

- To discuss the common social problems that faced the young around the world, such as the unemployment, the devaluation of labor, structural inequalities, and deteriorating quality of life, etc.
- To connect the movements activated by the youth around the world who are active in social innovation and social and economic areas, and to provide a chance for the youth to join together to seek a sustainable and inclusive society.
- To launch an international working group among the participants who belong to social venture/cooperatives/social economy supporting organizations/institutions to help the youth who wants to enter social innovation/social economy area, and to prepare an effective educational training system.
