The Roles of Business in Achieving the MDGs

Economic growth

- Increase productivity, create employment and generate higher income opportunities
- Boosts public income through taxes, allowing governments to invest more in social infrastructure and services

Inclusive business models

- Include the poor people into its value chains as producers, as partners, as employees and as consumers
- · Contribute to health and social standing of the poor by creating opportunities for them
- Knowledge/capabilities
- Provide knowledge and capabilities required to meet MDGs (e.g., HIV/AIDS: pharmaceutical companies, medical-care providers, pharmacies, sanitation providers)
- Support effective use of current knowledge through its managerial competencies
- Invest in human capital through vocational education and training to reduce skills gap
- Innovation
- Promote innovation to respond to the need of the developing countries (e.g., mobile banking, clean energy solutions, mobile clinics, e-libraries, etc.)
- Replication of success
- Replicate successful approaches in various countries, because it is not confined to one locality and many businesses operate across borders
- Act as a conveyor belt for innovative solutions
- 6 Advocacy
- Collectively advocate for effective government policies that are critical to growth of inclusive private, which leads to more inclusive economic growth
- 7 Financial resources
- Financial resources that can be made available for development (including potentially for UNDP) through CSR, marketing departments, R&D departments etc.

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UNDP Strategies

- New UNDP Strategic Plan 2014-17: Select Outcomes will include "signature issues" and initiatives for engagement with the private sector (e.g. Outcomes on inclusive and sustainable growth; conflict and natural disasters).
- New forward-looking UNDP Private Sector Strategy was endorsed in 2012. Key messages:
 - Engage with and support private sector to achieve key UNDP priorities (e.g. New Strategic Plan)
 - Engage in "transformative" multistakeholder partnerships for larger impact
 - Support inclusive markets and business approaches / solutions for long-term, sustainable results

Inclusive Employment and Social Partnership

- social partnership between CSOs and Ministry of Labour and Social Protection in the employment creation and social protection of vulnerable groups (victims of trafficking, domestic violence, women from poor households, single mothers and persons with disabilities).
- **Inclusive employment** of vulnerable groups pursued through **Sheltered employment** (social enterprises established by CSOs).
