Session Objectives/ Descriptions:

The SILK project is one of the six Peer Learning Partnerships of the OECD Global Action, funded by the European Union's Foreign Partnership Instrument Coordinated by Diesis Network, it gathers a consortium of important SSE organizations from EU countries, USA, Canada, Brazil, Mexico, India and Korea. It aims is to facilitate Peer Learning among public officials and senior managers from SSE companies and SSE networks about the internationalisation of SSE organisations.

Facilitated by Samuel Barco and reuniting 4 policy experts (two coming from SSE representative organisations and the other two from governments) that participated in the PLP this session proposes a discussion on the many lessons learned from the 11 varied cases presented and discussed during the Social Solidarity Economy International Learning and Knowledge Community of Peers.

We expect to:

- Share preliminary findings on project research on SSE enterprise internationalisation
- Engage with GSEF participants to get feedback on the project insights and activities in order to inform the project conclusions and recommendations
